SUMMARY:

LD 1544 proposed that the Legislative Council have oversight of budgets of Joint Standing Committees, Joint Select Committees, and Legislative Investigating Committees. The bill proposed detailed criteria to be included in committee budgets.

The sponsors prepared an amendment that would replace the bill. The amendment proposed that no study could be undertaken by a legislative committee unless the Legislative Council approved a budget for that committee.

The Committee amended the original bill with a version that required the Legislative Council to establish budgets, and proposed some criteria for the budgets. The Council was authorized to approve or disapprove studies requested by individual committees but not studies approved by the Legislature.

Senate Amendment "A" repealed the Committee amendment and replaced it with the amendment initially offered by the sponsors. This version passed both houses.

SUMMARY:

LD 331, the original bill which is the same bill as LD 338 presented to the Committee on State Government during the First Regular Session of the 111th Legislature, proposed that every project for which bonds are proposed to be issued and to be approved by the voters shall be submitted to the voters as a single question. The bill prohibits combining different projects into a single question for voter approval unless the projects are very closely related.

The types of projects and bonds that are (excluded) not governed by the prohibitions in the bill include:
