SUMMARY:

This bill requires all licensees for on-premise consumption to report all purchases of liquor to the State Liquor Commission. It also requires the commission to report back to the Joint Standing Committee on Legal Affairs on the effect of the elimination of the discount formerly extended to licensees has on revenue. But see LD 1568, House Amendment "C".

House Amendment "A" (H-248) (Not adopted) would have specifically referenced the desirability of a 3% discount.

SUMMARY:

This bill would have, in certain situations, required the municipal clerk to provide polling days for absentee voters staying in designated places, such as nursing homes and congregate housing for the elderly. Party representatives would have the opportunity to be present at the polling days. Absentee voters in the designated places could not vote before the polling day for that place. (At least 7 days before election day). Candidates or members of their immediate families cannot collect applications or ballots in the designated places.

House Amendment "A" (H-260) (Not adopted) would have lengthened the time between the last polling day and election day.

House Amendment "B" (H-261) (Not adopted) would have removed the restriction that absentee voters in a designated place not vote before the polling day for that place.

House Amendment "C" (H-283) (Not adopted) would have removed the restrictions on candidates.
