This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature, covering the Second Regular Session of the 112th Legislature. The summaries are arranged by LD number under each committee.

All Amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor if it is a floor amendment or the designation "CA" if it is a committee amendment. If the amendment was adopted in the House, the letter H appears after the sponsor. If it was adopted in the Senate, the letter S a Tana Pana appears.

Final action for each bill is listed to the right of the title. If final House action and Senate action differ, both are listed.

SUMMARY: L.D. 2309 was submitted in response to L.D. 2097. It requires the Workers' Compensation Commission to study the causes of delay within the system, focusing particularly on those cases in which the injured worker eventually prevailed and was disabled for more than 6 months. The Commission must report back to the Labor Committee by January 1, 1987.

Senate Amendment "A" (S-475) amended the bill by replacing the reference to the "Office of Policy and Legal Analysis" with "Legislative Council".
