SUMMARY: This bill reaffirmed that municipalities have the right to enact ordinances to regulate their harbors. A recent Superior Court decision held that such ordinances were in conflict with the statutory authority given to harbormasters and with the Bureau of Land Use authority over such matters.

Committee Amendment A specified the minimum number or moorings that must be provided to non-residents. It also placed an April 1, 1987 sunset on all provisions of the Act and required a study by the Department of Conservation to determine the proper long term legislation necessary for the handling of the complex issues involved in this Act.
