JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE BILL SUMMARIES MAY 1986

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature, covering the Second Regular Session of the 112th Legislature. The summaries are arranged by LD number under each committee.

All Amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor if it is a floor amendment or the designation "CA" if it is a committee amendment. If the amendment was adopted in the House, the letter H appears after the sponsor. If it was adopted in the Senate, the letter S appears.

Final action for each bill is listed to the right of the title. If final House action and Senate action differ, both are listed.

AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE SEPARATION OF JUVENILES FROM ADULTS WHEN JUVENILES ARE DETAINED IN COUNTY JAILS

PL 1985 c. 715

Sponsor: MATTHEWS, Z., Carpenter, Priest Committee Report: New Draft of LD 1983.

SUMMARY: Under current provisions of the Maine Juvenile Code, it is clear that a juvenile, upon arrest, may not be detained with adults in correctional facilities. Until this bill, the laws did not specifically state this prohibition with respect to juveniles who have been adjudicated as having committed juvenile offenses. The bill amends the dispositional provisions of the Maine Juvenile Code and the county law enforcement statutes to clearly state that a juvenile in any status in a county jail must be separated from adults.

LD AN ACT TO ESTABLISH POLICIES GOVERNING
2354 MEDICAL MALPRACTICE CLAIMS

SEN. ADHERED ONTP

Sponsor: TWITCHELL Committee Report: New Draft of LD 1945.

SUMMARY: The original bill, LD 1945, sought to establish a pretrial screening panel for medical malpractice actions, establish qualifications for expert witnesses in medical malpractice actions, establish limits on pain and suffering damages in these actions, establish a contingent fee schedule for plaintiffs' attorneys in medical malpractice actions, eliminate special proofs required in a malicious prosecution action stemming from an unsuccessful medical malpractice action, and deny punitive damages in medical malpractice actions.

LD 2354 sought to provide for a cap of \$250,000 on damages for pain and suffering in medical malpractice actions, and to establish a fee schedule for attorneys contingent fees in medical malpractice actions.
