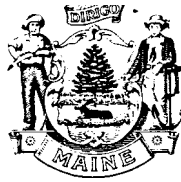

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature, covering the Second Special Session and the Third Special Session of the 112th Legislature. The summaries are arranged by LD number under each committee.

All Amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor if it is a floor amendment or the designation "CA" if it is a committee amendment. If the amendment was adopted in the House, the letter H appears after the sponsor. If it was adopted in the Senate, the letter S appears.

Final action for each bill is listed to the right of the title. If final House action and Senate action differ, both are listed.

AN ACT AMENDING THE CHARTER OF THE FARMINGTON  
VILLAGE CORPORATION

P&SL 1985

Committee Report: Not referred to Committee

SUMMARY: The immediate purpose of this bill was to allow the state to lease space in buildings that the Village Corporation may purchase, particularly for District Court 12. However, the bill itself grants much broader powers. It allows the Farmington Village Corporation to purchase, construct, or renovate buildings for office space for any governmental body, to lease office space to other governmental bodies and to sell these buildings to the town of Farmington.

While a referendum was mandated for passage of the original legislation setting up the Farmington Village Corporation, this bill, which revises the charter of the corporation, does not call for a voter referendum.
