LD 61 AN ACT TO CHANGE THE MEMBERSHIP ON THE BOARD OF ONTP  
CHIROPRACTIC EXAMINATION AND REGISTRATION

Sponsor: RACINE, Aliberti, Stevens, P., Erwin, P.  
Committee Report: ONTP

SUMMARY: The Board of Chiropractic Examination and Registration consists of 5 chiropractors and 1 public member. This bill adds a 2nd public member to the Board.

LD 63 AN ACT TO INCREASE THE LICENSING FEE OF LVWD  
FLORISTS

Sponsor: KIMBALL  
Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: This bill requires a \$5 per year license fee for florists. There is currently no fee.

LD 80 AN ACT TO AMEND THE EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS FOR ONTP  
CHIROPRACTORS

Sponsor: RACINE  
Committee Report: ONTP

SUMMARY: Currently an applicant for a chiropractors license must present proof of 2 years of satisfactory attendance at a liberal arts college and transcripts from an accredited college certifying completion of 2 years of pre-professional work. This bill changes the time requirement to 4 years and requires that 24 credit hours be in premedical courses.

LD 147 AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE PENALTY PROVISIONS FOR PL 1987  
THE LATE FILING OF CORPORATION REPORTS c. 32

Sponsor: JALBERT, Carroll, Ketover, Tuttle  
Committee Report: OTP  
Amendments Adopted:  
H-20 ALLEN

SUMMARY: The original bill referred to the requirement that corporations doing business in Maine file an annual report with the Secretary of State. Failure to file results in revocation for non-Maine corporations and suspension for Maine corporations. This report is required even if a corporation is suspended from doing business.
