AN ACT TO PROVIDE BETTER GEOGRAPHIC LVWD REPRESENTATION OF THE AREAS AFFECTED BY BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

Sponsor: COLLINS, Lisnik Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: LD 96 proposed that the appointing authority of any board (Governor, Speaker of the House, President of the Senate, Commissioner, etc.) be required to select members representing different geographical areas and different economic sectors affected by the board.

The Statement of Fact declares that the intent is to insure that local interests are represented on boards.

LD AN ACT TO ESTABLISH NEW YEAR'S DAY AS A STATE LVWD 132 HOLIDAY

Sponsor: BALDACCI, Gill Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: LD 132 proposed to make New Year's Day a business and school holiday on which most businesses and the schools will be closed. Currently, businesses may remain open on New Year's Day, and school boards are authorized to keep schools open on New Year's Day. The law (17 MRSA §3204) exempts many businesses from the mandatory business closing or holiday provision.

Testimony at the public hearing from businesses at some of Maine's shopping malls, indicated that these businesses boomed on New Year's day. Most of the businesses, when asked, indicated that employees were not forced to work on New Years' Day and were allowed to volunteer to work that day.

Under LD132, the opening of malls on News Years' Day is based on the decisions of the "anchor stores." If the major stores, (anchor stores) decide to remain open, all other stores in the malls are required to remain open.
