Committee Report: OTP-A

Amendments Adopted: H-44 COMMITTEE

SUMMARY: LD 266 proposed to make State antitrust law consistent with the federal laws by exempting local government units and local government officials from the triple damages provision of the antitrust law.

The Committee Amendment (H-44) added an application section to clarify that the new provisions would not apply to pending actions except in certain limited circumstances.

LD AN ACT TO CREATE THE LITIGATION ACCOUNTABILITY CARRY-OVER 268 ACT

Sponsor: HILLOCK, Collins Committee Report: Carry-Over

SUMMARY: The bill primarily seeks to require the court in any civil action to award reasonable attorneys fees and costs against any attorney or party who brings or defends a civil action that the court determines lacks substantial justification.

LD AN ACT TO CREATE A NONECONOMIC DAMAGES AWARD CARRY-OVER 269 ACT

Sponsor: HILLOCK, Collins Committee Report: Carry-Over

SUMMARY: The bill primarily seeks to limit damage awards in personal injury actions to economic damages of any amount and noneconomic damages of no more than \$250,000 or the amount of economic damages awarded, whichever amount is greater.
