SUMMARY

The bill sought to broaden the confidentiality given by statute for proceedings and records of proceedings concerning reviews of hospitals and medical staffs conducted by committees of health care personnel on behalf of hospitals. The bill added reviews of medical care and reviews on behalf of individual physicians to the statute. It also removed the ability to discover these these and content of proceedings upon a showing of good cause. These provisions are included in LD 2520.

SUMMARY

The bill sought to provide immunity from liability to directors of a nonprofit credit union for negligence of an employee of the credit union or for the negligence of another director of the credit union. A director of a nonprofit

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credit union would thus have been liable only for negligence personal to the director or for intentional torts of the director. This issue is addressed in LD 2520.

An Act Regarding Liability for Foster Parents for Children LD LV/WD 535 and Adults

SUMMARY

The bill sought to provide immunity from civil liability to foster parents of children and adult foster home providers if the foster parent was licensed, approved as meeting standards for licensure, or caring for a child at the request of the Department of Human Services pending licensure or approval. Such a foster parent would not have been immune from civil liability for willful or intentional abuse or neglect, or for gross neglect that resulted in serious harm to the child or adult. In these cases of liability, the damages for a single occurrence would have been limited to \$10,000.

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
