AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE PORTLAND SCHOOL OF ART  
TO CONFER A MASTER OF FINE ARTS DEGREE.

SUMMARY: This bill would have allowed the Portland School  
of Art to confer the degree of Master of Fine Art.

LD AN ACT TO PERMIT CERTAIN YOUNG PEOPLE TO OBTAIN LVWD  
501 A HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY CERTIFICATE AT A  
YOUNGER AGE.

SUMMARY: The bill would have permitted teenage parents to  
enroll in a GED program if they were at least 15 years of  
age and if their child care responsibilities prevent them  
from enrolling in a regular public school.

LD AN ACT CONCERNING RAISING THE NUMBER OF LVWD  
612 MANDATORY SCHOOL DAYS.

Sponsor: LAWRENCE, Rolde  
Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: This bill would have increased the length of the  
school year from 180 to 185 days, and increased mandatory  
instructional days to 180. This was not the intent of the  
bill's sponsor, who wanted to increase the number of days  
that could be used for in-service teacher training from 5  
to 10. The committee felt, since school units may increase  
the length of their school year up to 190 days without  
departmental approval and longer with approval, there is no  
need to make statutory changes now.

LD AN ACT RELATING TO CONFERRING DEGREES BY THE P&SL 1987  
633 UNIVERSITY OF NEW ENGLAND IN BIDDEFORD. c. 14

SUMMARY: This bill expands the authority of the University  
of New England by allowing the University to confer the  
degree of Master of Social Work.
