RESOLUTION, PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF MAINE REQUIRING RESIDENCY OF CANDIDATES 3 MONTHS BEFORE FILING DEADLINE

CON RES 1987

Sponsor: VOSE

Committee Report: OTP-A

Amendments Adopted: H-178 COMMITTEE

SUMMARY: The Maine Constitution requires candidates to be residents of the districts they seek to represent as of 3 months before they are elected. This resolution proposes an amendment to the Constitution to change that deadline to 3 months before they file their nomination papers. The question must be approved by the voters by referendum.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-178) changed the deadline to the time of the candidate's nomination for placement on any ballot, whether for a primary, general or special election. It also rewrites the referendum question to reflect this change.

LD AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE SALE OF CERTAIN VINTAGE LVWD 581 WINES TO LICENSEES

Sponsor: TWITCHELL Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: Currently, nonlicenses cannot sell liquor to a restaurant or other person holding a liquor license. This bill would allow nonlicensees to sell bottled vintage wine to licensees if each bottle is labelled that it was acquired from a private collection. This subject will be considered with LD 1269 which the Committee is carrying over.

LD AN ACT TO AMEND THE LOCAL LIQUOR OPTION 591 REFERENDUM QUESTIONS

ONTP

Sponsor: SCARPINO

Committee Report: ONTP

SUMMARY: Current law does not provide separate local option questions for the sale of wine. This bill would create 2 new questions concerning the sale of wine, one for consumption off the premises, and one for consumption on the premises. (Local option questions were amended in LD 1842.)
