LD · AN ACT RELATING TO QUALIFICATIONS FOR A HOTEL ND LD 1645 787 LIQUOR LICENSE

LD AN ACT TO AMEND THE LAW REGARDING TRAINING FOR CARRY-OVER 790 LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS

Sponsor: KANY, Tupper, Ketover, Paul Committee Report: Carry-over

SUMMARY: This bill would require that law enforcement officers, before they may carry a gun or have arrest powers, must complete the basic training course at the Maine Criminal Justice Academy. Current law requires that they complete the training within 6 months of starting work.

The Legal Affairs Committee received permission to carry-over this bill and LD 1452 to undertake one comprehensive study on law enforcement training and the Maine Criminal Justice Academy.

LD AN ACT RELATING TO OLD CEMETERIES 796

LVWD

Sponsor: ROLDE

Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: This bill would require municipalities to provide care and maintenance of public cemeteries and burial grounds. Any municipality violating the provisions would be fined up to \$250 for each violation. The bill also would make violating any tomb or grave a Class D crime, and damaging or removing any grave marker or monument a Class E crime. See LD 1719.

Committee Report: OTP-A

Amendments Adopted: H-314 COMMITTEE

SUMMARY: The bill would amend the public drinking law to include as a Class E crime operating a motor vehicle while drinking liquor.

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Committee Amendment "A" (H-314) replaces the bill, and makes operating a motor vehicle on a public way while drinking liquor a civil violation.

9 PRIMARY ELECTIONS

Sponsor: ARMSTRONG, Whitcomb Committee Report: ONTP

<u>SUMMARY:</u> This bill would change the statewide primary from the 2nd Tuesday of June to the 2nd Tuesday of September. This would move the filing dates from April 1st to June 1st.

AN ACT TO LIMIT THE PENALTY A LANDLORD CAN CHARGE A TENANT FOR LATE PAYMENT OF RENT

PL 1987 c. 215

Sponsor: MELENDY, Ketover, Bickford, Andrews Committee Report: OTP-A

Amendments Adopted:

H-149 COMMITTEE

SUMMARY: Current law does not address penalties for late payment of rent. This bill allows a landlord to charge a tenant up to the greater of 18% of the amount due for one month or \$10 if the tenant does not pay the rent within 15 days of when the payment is due. (The sponsor intended the percentage to be 18% annually or 1 1/2% of a month's rent.)

Committee Amendment "A" (H-149) changes the permissible penalty to not more than 4% of one month's rent. It also prohibits a landlord from charging any penalty for late
