LVWD

AN ACT TO ASSURE THAT STATE REGULATION OF LD AGRICULTURAL CHEMICALS WILL NOT BE MORE 615 RESTRICTIVE THAN FEDERAL REGULATIONS.

Sponsor: TARDY, Black, Matthews Z, Lord Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: This bill would have required that no state regulation related to agricultural chemicals may be more stringent than existing federal regulation.

AN ACT TO REVISE THE LAW PROHIBITING THE USE OF PL 1987 LD747 DRUGS IN ANIMALS COMPETING IN PULLING EVENTS.

c. 111 **EMERGENCY**

Sponsor: WEBSTER C, Tardy Committee Report: OTP-A Amendments Adopted: S-37 COMMITTEE

SUMMARY: This bill prohibits the administration of drugs to animals entered into competitive pulling contests. Committee Amendment "A" (S-37) does allow, however, the administration of therapeutic drugs to animals requiring treatment, provided that the treatment does not unduly affect the performance of the animal in the competition.

LDAN ACT TO RECODIFY THE ANIMAL WELFARE LAWS. 811

ONTP

Sponsor: CLARK N, Tardy, Black, Pines Committee Report: ONTP

SUMMARY: This bill is the recodification of the state animal welfare laws, both civil and criminal. It represents the effort of the Animal Welfare Board to organize current law into a more useable text and to remove ambiguities, inconsistencies and duplication. This bill makes no substantive changes in current law. LD 811 was subsequently amalgamated with LD 838, AN ACT to Reform the Animal Welfare Laws, which finally was replaced by LD 1759.

AN ACT TO REQUIRE BEEKEEPERS TO EFFECTIVELY LD PROTECT HIVES PLACED IN AREAS WITH DENSE BEAR 823 POPULATIONS.

LVWD

Sponsor: CONLEY JR., Baker Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: The purpose of this bill was to require beekeepers to protect their hives with adequate electric

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fencing approved by the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources and to prohibit the setting of traps in the near vicinity of beehives to kill bears.

SUMMARY: See New Draft LD 1759.

LD AN ACT RELATING TO THE LABELING OF MILK. 839

LVWD

Sponsor: TARDY, Parent, Whitcomb, Nutting Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: This bill would have required that labels on milk sold in Maine conspicuously name the state in which the milk was processed and packaged.

LD AN ACT TO INSURE CLEAN-UP CAPABILITY BY
900 PERSONS UNDERTAKING MOVEMENT OF HAZARDOUS
MATERIALS.

ONTP

Sponsor: PARADIS E, Perkins Committee Report: ONTP

<u>SUMMARY:</u> The bill would have required any person using any pesticides, poisons or hazardous chemicals to have sufficient clean-up equipment on hand to clean up any spill. If there is a spill, the person would be required to report it to DEP and to clean it up.

AN ACT TO ENCOURAGE INVESTMENT IN THE 911 DEVELOPMENT OF POTATO VARIETIES.

Sponsor: MAHANY, Pines, Collins Committee Report: OTP-A Amendments Adopted: H-183 COMMITTEE S-123 DUTREMBLE D

SUMMARY: The purpose of this bill is to encourage the introduction of new potato varieties into Maine by protecting the right of the developer of a new seed variety .

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
