LD AN ACT TO ELIMINATE AD DAMNUM CLAUSE IN CASES CARRY-OVER
820 INVOLVING UNLIQUIDATED DAMAGES

Committee Report: Carry-Over

SUMMARY: The bill states that the statute which prohibits the placing in a medical malpractice complaint of a dollar amount claimed does not apply to a demand for liquidated damages.

LD AN ACT TO ELIMINATE PROFITS IN CRIMINAL LVWD
827 ACTIVITIES

Sponsor: MARTIN, J. Paradis, P., Melendy, Thistle
Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: LD 827 proposed to expand the criminal forfeiture law by permitting forfeiture of property used in the commission of any crime, not just drug-related offenses.

LD AN ACT PERTAINING TO CIVIL LIABILITY FOR CARRY-OVER
832 VOLUNTEERS

Sponsor: SMITH, Soucy, Michaud, Strout, D.
Committee Report: Carry-Over

SUMMARY: The bill seeks to provide immunity from civil liability to employees and volunteers of charitable or nonprofit organizations. The immunity applies when the volunteer or employee provides services in good faith and without charge and injury or death arises from the activities of the organization. The immunity does not apply if the death or injury results from gross negligence, recklessness, or intentional misconduct of the organization.

LD AN ACT CONCERNING THE USE OF FORCE IN LVWD
833 PROPERTY OFFENSES

Sponsor: STEVENSON, Hichborn
Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: Much like current law, this bill sought to permit a person or his duly authorized agent acting on his behalf to use physical force upon another in an instance of unlawful taking of his property, criminal mischief, or a retaking of his property immediately following its taking. This justified use of physical force would have exempted the person from civil liability based on the use of force.
