LD 869 AN ACT RELATING TO THE STATE SUBDIVISION LAW. ONTP

Sponsor: RANDALL, Look, Farren, Vose  
Committee Report: ONTP

SUMMARY: The bill deleted a statutory exemption from the local subdivision review law. The exemption provides that lots greater than 40 acres in size do not count as lots for the purpose of the subdivision law. While the committee ultimately rejected the bill, the committee did incorporate provisions addressing this issue in LD 1764.

LD 883 AN ACT RELATING TO LOCAL SCHOOL COSTS AND THE LOCAL SUBDIVISION LAW. ONTP

Sponsor: WARREN, Ridley, Soucy, Nadeau GR  
Committee Report: ONTP

SUMMARY: The bill amended the statutory authority for local subdivision review by including new authority for a municipality to review the impact of a proposed subdivision on local educational costs and to assess fees against the subdivider to cover those costs.

LD 903 AN ACT TO CLARIFY DEFINITION LANGUAGE UNDER THE SITE LOCATION OF DEVELOPMENT LAWS. PL 1987 c. 130

Sponsor: STEVENS P, Hoglund, Michaud, Usher  
Committee Report: OTP-A  
Amendments Adopted:  
H-84 COMMITTEE

SUMMARY: The bill restructured, without substantive change, the definition of the term, "development which may substantially affect the environment" in the Site Location Act. The committee amendment made minor technical changes.
