SUMMARY: This bill sought to encourage school units which do not operate schools to contract with a school offering the lowest tuition costs so that the result would be the lowest educational costs. The committee by letter directed the department to work with the sponsor to determine whether a problem exists in this area, how to address it if it does and the fiscal impact of addressing it.

<u>SUMMARY:</u> This resolve would have created a commission to study special education programs, including:

- 1. certification and training of teachers;
- 2. parent involvement in the development of the Indidualized Education Plan;
- 3. the working relationship between parents, teachers and the school administration during Pupil Evaluation Team Meetings; and
- 4. differences between special education teaching and regular classroom teaching.

The committee felt that special education issues had been adequately addressed by the Joint Select Committee for Learning Disabled Children and that LD 449 was an appropriate vehicle for legislation dealing with those issues.
