AN ACT CONCERNING VETERANS' BENEFITS

ONTP

Sponsor: WEBSTER C, Bailey
Committee Report: ONTP

SUMMARY: Present law differentiates between financial assistance and educational benefits available to children of disabled veterans. The definition of children under the financial assistance section is broader and includes stepchildren. The bill would have made the two definitions equivalent by applying the broader definition to educational benefits.

LD AN ACT RELATING TO THE COST-OF-LIVING FORMULA INDEF. PP
1012 FOR RETIREES UNDER THE MAINE STATE RETIREMENT SYSTEM

SUMMARY: The bill would have amended the method of calculating cost-of-living increases for benefits under the Maine State Retirement System. At present the formula is based on the Consumer Price Index but limited to 4%. In recent years the average increase has been around 3%. The bill would have allowed the uncompensated inflation from years in which the inflation was over 4% to be carried over and applied to years in which the inflation was under 4%.

Amendments Adopted:
H-134 COMMITTEE

SUMMARY: The bill requires that the methods and assumptions adopted by the Board of Directors of the Retirement System be used to calculate the cost of benefits established through collective bargaining agreements.

The committee amendment (H-134) just clarifies the language as it applies to collective bargaining agreements in participating districts.
