SUMMARY: This will would have required a hospital to recognize the total allowance for bad debts as reported by a hospital's financial records.

LDAN ACT TO ENSURE ACCESSIBILITY TO MENTAL HEALTHPL 19871043SERVICES FOR DEAF PERSONSc. 331

Sponsor: GAUVREAU, Gill, Pines, Connolly Committee Report: OTP

<u>SUMMARY:</u> This bill required the Bureau of Mental Health to provide accommodations and services to hearing impaired persons in order to provide them with better access the mental health programs funded or licensed by the Bureau.

LD AN ACT RELATING TO REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSE TO LVWD 1060 OPERATE A NURSERY SCHOOL

Sponsor: SWAZEY, Bost, Simpson Committee Report: LVWD

<u>SUMMARY:</u> This bill would have established qualifications for the director of a nursery school.

Sponsor: BRAGG, Martin J, Hussey, Brawn Committee Report: OTP-A Amendments Adopted: H-306 COMMITTEE

SUMMARY: The original resolve mandated a moratorium on school-based health clinics while a special commission would have studied public school clinics which provided counseling and services related to pregnancy. The Resolve,

Office of Policy and Legal Analysispage 36 Human Resources as amended, created a commission to study the need for school-based health services established to address adolescent health needs and concerns including, but not limited to: pregnancy, parenting, suicide, mental health, substance abuse, and sexuality and to recommend appropriate educational programs and health services which may appropriately be provided in the public schools.

LDAN ACT TO REQUIRE THAT CHILDREN UNDER THEONTP1137CUSTODY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES BE
PLACED IN HOMES WITH TRADITIONAL FAMILY SETTINGS

Sponsor: LOOK, Dellert, LaPointe, Randall Committee Report: ONTP

<u>SUMMARY:</u> This bill sought to prohibit placing foster children in "nontraditional" homes by establishing priority guidelines for acceptable foster parents. The priority for placement was relatives, married couples, persons with parenting experience, and persons without parenting experience. Placement in nontraditional homes, i.e. unmarried couples or single people, required exceptional circumstances and no traditional family setting available or likely to be available.

LD AN ACT PERTAINING TO BREAST CANCER TREATMENT LVWD 1169

Sponsor: CROWLEY, Taylor, Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: This bill would have required physicians to inform patients with breast cancer of the various medical treatments available to them.

LD AN ACT TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF INFORMATION LVWD 1196 AVAILABLE TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES ON RADIOACTIVE EMISSIONS FROM NUCLEAR POWER PLANTS

Sponsor: HOLT, Kany Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: This bill sought to create an off-site monitoring system for radioactive emissions from the Maine Yankee nuclear power plant. It would have established on-line gaseous and liquid effluent monitors and a series of gross gamma detectors. The on-line effluent monitors were incorporated into LD 1416.

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
