Services. The bill would have also provided funding for the first 2 years of operation. Project REACH was designed to serve economically and educationally disadvantaged youth in pursuing post-secondary education by offsetting federal cuts for disadvantaged students and providing instruction in basic college skills, counselling, tutoring and special programs. The committee amendment corrected the appropriation clause. The committee supported the bill and highly recommended it receive funding. However, the bill failed to receive funding on the Appropriations Table.

LD 1139 AN ACT RELATING TO THE TOWN OF YORK SCHOOL DISTRICT.

P&SL 1987 c. 25 EMERGENCY

SUMMARY: The bill revised the Charter of the Town of York School District. The School District has authority over the construction and repair of school buildings in the Town of York. The original bill raised the debt service limit of the district to \$12 million. The committee amendment raised the debt service limit to \$20 million. The amendment also clarifies the school committee's and school district's responsibilities regarding minor capital costs.

LD AN ACT CONCERNING COMPREHENSIVE DRUG PREVENTION LVWD 1158 EDUCATION IN MAINE'S PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

Sponsor: BRAWN, Randall, Harper, Twitchell Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: This bill would have required the development and implementation of a comprehensive substance abuse prevention curriculum in all public and private schools covering grades K-12. The department opposed the bill on the grounds that the intent of the bill was already being accomplished within the drug education program of the department. Furthermore, the department's program takes a comprehensive approach and to focus solely on curriculum as this bill proposed could slow the development of the more inclusive comprehensive program. The committee, following discussion with the sponsor, decided to grant leave to withdraw to the bill and to develop a joint resolution recognizing the Division of Alcohol and Drug Education Services for their work and urging them to continue their comprehensive community outreach approach to substance abuse education. The committee drafted the resolution which was approved and introduced by the original sponsors
