The bill prohibits electric utilities from charging a hookup fee for the installation of a 200 amp service. In the 1986 CMP rate design case, the Public Utilities Commission approved a hookup charge of \$600 for new residential services over 100 amps as a contribution towards the cost of the generating capacity to serve that customer. Similarly, the October 1, 1986 Bangor Hydro rate design ordered a hookup charge.

AN ACT TO AMEND THE CHARTER OF SEARSPORT WATER LD LVWD 1175 DISTRICT

SUMMARY: The bill extends the boundaries of the Searsport Water District to include Stockton Springs. Stockton Springs is already served by the district. No referendum is included.

RESOLVE, TO CREATE A COMMISSION TO STUDY THE LVWD LD COST OF REPLACEMENT POWER IN CASE OF A SHUTDOWN 1189 EMERGENCY OF THE MAINE YANKEE POWER PLANT

Sponsor: CONLEY, JR., Baker, Erwin, E, Committee Report: LVWD

The bill establishes a commission to study the costs of replacing the power in case Maine Yankee is closed by mandate. The commission would have 7 members: 2 Senators, 2 Representatives, The Directors of the State Planning and the Energy Resources Offices, and a public member appointed by the Governor. Their report is due January 31, 1988. \$10,000 is appropriated from the General Fund.
