LD AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE PAYMENT OF REASONABLE LVWD 1120 ATTORNEYS FEES IN SUCCESSFUL LIBEL AND SLANDER SUITS

SUMMARY: This bill would have required the court to award attorneys fees and costs to any plaintiff who prevailed in an action for libel or slander.

SUMMARY: The bill requires municipalities to mark barriers placed across ways held and designated for motor vehicle passage to protect snowmobilers traveling on those ways in the winter and all-terrain vehicle operators, motorcyclists, and others traveling on those ways in other

seasons. Municipal officers must cause the barriers to be inspected periodically to assure that the marking remains. The bill makes violation of these requirements a civil violation.
