LD RESOLUTION, PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO THE ONTP 1389 CONSTITUTION OF MAINE TO PROVIDE FOR THE POPULAR ELECTION OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, SECRETARY OF STATE, TREASURER OF STATE AND STATE AUDITOR

SUMMARY: LD 1389 proposed that the Constitutional Officers (Secretary of State, Attorney General, State Treasurer, and State Auditor) be elected by the citizens of the State at the general election in the same manner as the Governor and the Representatives and Senators of the State Legislature are elected.

With the exception of the State Auditor who would serve a 4 year term, the other Constitutional Officers would serve 2 year terms. These terms of office would be the same as current terms.

LDAN ACT TO PREVENT ABUSE OF HANDICAPPED PARKINGPL 19871402SPACESc. 390

SUMMARY: LD 1402 amends the statutes relating to public accommodations for physically handicapped people. Current provisions of the law (5 MRSA §§4593, 4594, and 4594-A) are aimed at providing equal access for handicapped people to public facilities by requiring walkways, doors, and restroom facilities to meet certain standards.

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LD 1402 addresses parking accommodations to provide easier access for handicapped persons to public accommodations. The bill proposes to require the designation of at least one parking space for every 25 parking spaces available to the public on a public or private parking lot.

LD 1402 also amends the statute relating to municipal ordinances that are enacted to provide for handicapped parking. The bill changes the penalty from a maximum fine of \$25 to a minimum fine of \$50 unless a municipal ordinance establishes a different penalty.

The bill applies to existing facilities, and facilities constructed in the future.

This bill was amended twice. One amendment changed the ratio of handicapped parking spaces to parking spaces available to the general public from 1 to 20 to 1 to 25. This amendment also establishes a \$50 fine for all infractions of this law and mandates that owners of private off-street parking shall arrange for enforcement by private means or public agencies. A second amendment defines clearly marked to include painted signs on pavement, vertical standing signs or barriers which are visible in existing weather conditions.

SUMMARY: LD 1407 amends Title 5, section 948, to place the Director of Safety within the category of major policy-influencing positions within the Department of Public Safety. LD 1407 was amended to make it emergency legislation.

SUMMARY: LD 1446 enables the Governor to order emergency activition of state military forces in advance of an imminent disaster. Present law does not explicitly allowmobilization of the state military forces, such as the National Guard, to prepare for an imminent disaster. For
