SUMMARY: This bill, as amended, provides a waiver, in certain instances, of the need for a full certificate of need review for certain instances of in-home care.

SUMMARY: This bill, as amended by the committee amendment, makes certain procedural changes to the certificate of need process to expedite review of applications. In addition, the Senate amendment raises the certificate of need threshold for skilled or intermediate care facilities from \$350,000 to \$500,000 and requires all transfers of ownership for those facilities to be reviewed regardless of the threshold amount involved.
