LD AN ACT TO PERMIT PARTICIPANTS TO PLAY BEANO IN 1524 2 OR MORE ROOMS

LVWD

Sponsor: ALLEN

Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: Current law allows the State Police to adopt rules governing beano games. One rule adopted is that beano may be conducted in only one room for each beano license. This bill would prohibit the State Police from promulgating any rule which limits beano games to one room. One purpose behind the bill was to allow nonsmokers to play beano in a smoke-free room.

LD AN ACT RELATING TO THE DEFINITION OF FULL-TIME LVWD 1530 CORRECTIONS OFFICER

Sponsor: PERKINS, Greenlaw, Gill, Baldacci Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: Current law defines full-time corrections officer based on the amount of money the officer is reasonably expected to earn in one year. The definition is used to determine who must go through training at the Criminal Justice Academy -- full-time officers are required to by statute, less than full-time are not. By basing the definition on expected earnings, and because the counties have different pay scales, corrections officers in the different counties are treated unequally. This bill would base full-time status on the number of hours on-duty per year.

LD AN ACT TO AMEND THE TRI-STATE LOTTO COMPACT LVWD 1533

Sponsor: GOULD, R. R., Jalbert Committee Report: LVWD

SUMMARY: This bill would amend the Maine law concerning the Tri-State Lotto Compact to allow the State Lottery Commission to decide whether to let other states join Vermont, New Hampshire and Maine in the Tri-State Lottery.
