"ceiling" or pool of IDBs among the various issuing agencies, but not by specific program. Each issuing agency would allocate its own share of the pool among the several uses or users of these monies.

In addition, by unanimous consent of all the IDB issuing agencies, any portion of the pool that is not allocated or an allocated portion that has not been used, can be allocated or reallocated as agreed by the agencies.

The bill also provides for allocations by the Maine Educational Loan Marketing Corporation which is a new IDB issuing agency for the issue of student loans.

The bill further allocates the IDBs (\$117,000,000) that were not allocated in the previous "interim" allocation for 1987 and part of the 1988 ceiling.

LD AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE BUREAU OF PL 1987 INTERGOVERNMENTAL DRUG ENFORCEMENT WITHIN THE c. 411 THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY

- SUMMARY: LD 1837 creates, coordinates and manages regional drug task forces at the state level by creating a new Bureau of Intergovernmental Drug Enforcement within the Department of Public Safety. This new bureau, in conjunction with an Intergovernmental Drug Enforcement Policy Board, will administer a regional task force program comprised of municipal, county, state and federal law enforcement personnel. The bill contemplates the direct involvement by the office of the Attorney General and the United States Atttorney for the District of Maine.

The Bureau of Intergovernmental Drug Enforcement consists of a director, an assistant director, task force investigative supervisors and task force investigative agents. In addition, the Attorney General and the United States Attorney for the District of Maine may assign task force attorneys to assist in the effort. The Intergovernmental Drug Enforcement Policy Board consists of, ex officio, the Commission of Public Safety, the Attorney General, the Chief of the Maine State Police and the United States Attorney for the District of Maine. The board's membership also includes 2 members to be appointed by the Governor.

S-200 USHER

SUMMARY: LD 700 would have instituted a minimum fine of \$10, with a maximum of \$25, for any parking violations at the capitol complex. It also allows the Commissioner of Public Safety to promulgate rules to allow the towing of any illegally parked cars on the complex.

The new draft allows the Commissioner of Public Safety to adopt, by rule, a schedule of parking violation fees to be approved by the Governor. The minimum fine is \$15 for each offense. It also extends the authority of the capitol police and the Commissioner of Public Safety to all parking areas designated by the Bureau of Public Improvements and the superintendent of the Augusta Mental Health Institute.
