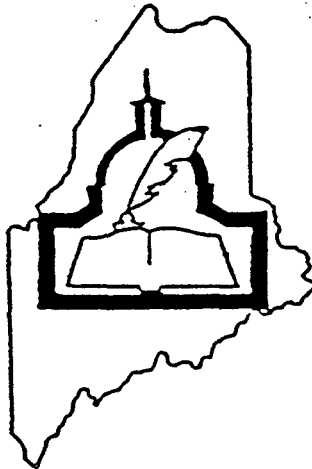

SUMMARY
New Draft Of LD 1909

The original bill LD 1909 exempts the applicant who successfully obtains a certificate of need for the first Continuing Care Retirement Community (CCRC) Demonstration project from the laws regulating CCRC's.

The new draft does not exempt demonstration project applicants from current law entirely. However, it does permit demonstration project applicants to collect up to 10% of the entrance fee, exempting them from the \$1,000 limit on the initial deposit pertaining to all other CCRC's. The new draft also has a refund provision for unsuccessful applicants' subscribers.

The new draft also makes changes in current law which apply to all CCRC's. It provides that a subscriber's deposit must be refunded with interest should the facility not open. The interest will not be refunded if the subscriber chooses not to join after the CCRC is operational.
