SUMMARY

The original bill would allow cemeteries to sell and use certain unoccupied interment spaces, after proper notice is given to the record owners of the spaces.

Senate Amendment "A" (S-313) was introduced for the Committee. It clarifies certain language concerning which spaces may be used, and provides more specificity in the notice requirements. It also exempts small (less than 1/2 acre) from the provisions.
