CARROLL

Maine currently has a statutory requirement calling for a state commission on intergovernmental relations. In recent years members have not been designated for this commission, it has not been funded and it has not met.

This bill provides \$10,000 per year for meeting expenses and changes the membership from 7 to 17 members. It raises the State representatives from 2 to 3, adds 5 county representatives, adds 3 municipal representatives, bringing that total to 5, adds a representative from MMA and the County Commissioners Association, and eliminates the 1 member from the general public.

In the current law 4 members are appointed by the Governor and the remainder by the Legislature. This bill maintains the Governor's appointees at 4 and has the remaining 13 appointed by the Legislature.

Committee Amendment A (S-354), adds 2 executive branch officials and adds several provisions to bring the Commission's administration into conformity with Legislative Council guidelines; requires presentation of a work plan to the Committee on State and Local Government by May 1, 1989, including

recommendations as to permanent staff, commission compensation and desired number of meetings. This plan is to include the time and costs for developing a data base which would allow a report on the financial status of local governments; removes the emergency clause, and; adjusts the appropriation to reflect the later start date.

SUMMARY

This bill is a result of the study of state mandates by a subcommittee of the Committee on State and Local Government: It requires that all bills containing state mandates to local governments be referred to a State and Local Government "appropriation table". The bills would not necessarily contain fiscal notes. The bill requires the reactivation of the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs. This office is currently required by an executive order but has not functioned for some time.

Committee Amendment A (H-578) adds a provision that at least 2 weeks shall elapse between the time a state mandate bill is introduced and the time that it may be passed, adds a requirement that the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs monitor the effect of federal policies on state government, as well as on county and local government. It also requires the Office of the Governor to submit a status report relative to the intergovernmental functions required by this act.
