Current law prohibits landlords from discriminating against tenants with children. An interpretation of the law does not include mobile home parks renting lots, not mobile homes. This bill would have included rental of mobile home lots under the law incorporated into LD 2147, Committee Amendment "A".

SUMMARY

New Draft Of LD 1377

The original bill (LD 1377) sought to clarify duties and procedures of notaries. The New Draft (LD 2176) clarifies that notaries may not notarize documents for immediate family members because of the potential conflict of interest. The new draft also clarifies that a notary may be removed from office due to improper conduct, and requires the Secretary of State to recommend that all notaries keep records of their notarial acts.
