SUMMARY

New Draft Of LD 2087

The original bill permits the inclusion in rate base of cost effective conservation and load management improvements paid for by a utility on the premises of a customer.

This new draft changes dates to permit its application to petitions filed with the PUC after January 1, 1988, corrects syntax and clarifies legislative intention that nothing in this new draft is intended either to impair the status of a cogenerator or small power producer as a qualifying facility by virtue of the presence of conservation or load management investment on its

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premises, or to limit the authority of the PUC to permit recovery of utility investment in a plant on the premises of customers for purposes of providing improved customer service, such as uninterrupted supply packages.

This bill increases the debt limit of the South Berwick Sewer District from \$500,000 to \$3,000,000.

SUMMARY

Original bill amends the law restricting transportation of water by adding exceptions for water used in well-drilling, construction, cement mixing, swimming pools, firefighting, hospitals or civil defense. It also establishes a commission to study water supply issues.

The Committee Amendment adds exceptions to the water transportation law for distilled water produced in a manufacturing process, water used in aquaculture and water used for bottling if the source of water was used prior to July 1, 1987. It also provides that any authorization to transport water granted by the Commissioner of Human Services shall be subject to subsequent legislative limitations. The Committee Amendment removes the study proposed in the original bill because a similar study is being recommended in another bill.
