SUMMARY
New Draft Of LD 1581

The new draft recodifies the pharmacy laws and incorporates changes recommended by the Audit Committee. It makes Maine law more compatible with the national uniform act. It also distinguishes between licensing of Maine pharmacists and drug outlets in Maine, registering of out-of-state mail order companies, and registering of out of state manufacturers.

It also makes the Pharmacy Board an internal board of the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation.

The two Senate amendments make technical cross reference changes, makes it clear that the commissioner can review the board's budget, clarifies the manner in which generic drugs can be substituted, and replaces the appropriations section with an allocation section.
