SUMMARY

This bill implements the interim recommendations of the Special Commission to Study School Entrance Age and Preschool Services. The bill makes no change in the current school entrance age but restructures, renames and redirects the work of the study commission. The new commission, the Special Commission on Early Childhood Development and Education, is directed to examine a number of issues necessary to provide developmentally appropriate early childhood programs to preschool and school age children. The commission is to report to the Legislature by December 15, 1988.

The committee amendment clarifies the appointment process for the Department of Education and Cultural Services and the Department of Human Services members of the commission.

The Senate amendment changes the reporting date for the commission to December 1, 1988 and reduces the amount appropriated to the commission.

SUMMARY

ND Maj Rpt of 2311

The original bill prohibited smoking in elementary and ols while school is in session or student activities are being conducted unless part of a classroom demonstration. School employees would be subject to the Workplace Smoking Act which permits the establishment of, or negotiation for, designated smoking areas.

The new draft prohibits tobacco use, including the use of smokeless tobacco, by students or school employees in school buildings or on school grounds during school hours unless part of a bona fide educational demonstration or unless a designated smoking area has been established for employees under the Workplace Smoking Act or unless employees have collectively bargained for a smoking area under the Smoking in Public Buildings Law. Any smoking area established must be located away from areas frequented by students.
