

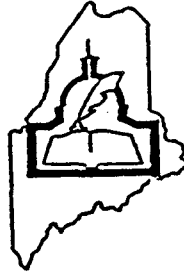

SUMMARY

This bill was the minority report of the Committee pursuant to its review of the 2-inch clam law as required by Title 12, section 6681. It recommends reducing the minimum length to 1 1/2 inch and removing the tolerance factor.
