SUMMARY

LD 41 proposed that:

- 1. The Department of Economic and Community Development analyze the State's economy with respect to international trade and determine the State's strengths, assets, and liabilities in regard to international trade;
- 2. The department formulate an international trade strategy based on the State's strengths and
- 3. The department evaluate all means that can best exploit international trade including creation of a foreign trade office, and the means to reduce or eliminate barriers to development of international trade;
- 4. The department coordinate international trade efforts and resources within the State to maximize the use of state resources;
- 5. The department investigate the feasibility of creating a New England regional trade council for purposes of promoting and developing international trade for the region and attracting investment to New England;
- 6. The department, in conjunction with the Department of Administration, Office of Information Systems, investigate the feasibility of the creation of an international trade data and information system to serve the public and private sectors;
- 7. The department investigate various approaches to a certification of quality program which will encourage domestic and foreign purchasers to buy goods and services produced in Maine.
