An Act to Amend the Laws Governing the Operation of a Watercraft While Under the Influence (Reported Pursuant to Resolves of 1987, Chapter 111)

SUMMARY

This bill contains the recommendations of the Maine Special Commission on Boating, created by Resolve 1987, chapter 111. The bill conforms the penalties and enforcement procedures regarding operating a watercraft while under the influence to those regarding motor vehicle OUI. The bill also creates a duty, and corresponding civil violation, for watercraft operators to submit to a chemical test when requested by a law enforcement officer with probable cause to believe that that operator has been operating under the influence.

Committee Amendment "A" expressly authorizes municipalities to enter into mutual law enforcement aid agreements to enforce the drunk boating laws. The amendment also provides that the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and the Department of Marine Resources would receive revenues derived from and defray enforcement expenses with moneys collected from watercraft OUI fines.
