SUMMARY

Currently, war veterans and veterans with service-connected disabilities receive preference points when applying for classified positions in State Government, if they are not receiving a nondisability retirement pension for their military service. This bill removes the restriction concerning the retirement pension and allows these particular veterans to receive preference points without any qualifications regarding any service pension.

SUMMARY

This bill allows persons who are state employees or public school teachers and who were paid for any type of services from the Governor's expense account during the years 1974-1978 to purchase up to 2 years service credit in the Maine State Retirement System for the years during which they received such payments.

SUMMARY

This bill would allow teachers who are members of the Maine State Retirement System to purchase service time for the years they taught at a private college under certain conditions; namely, that they have 10 years of service in public schools, pay the actuarial cost of the added pension, and previously contributed to the Maine State Retirement System when they taught at a secondary institute affiliated with the college.
