SUMMARY

This bill provides the current services allocations from the Highway Fund and certain other funds for Fy 1989-90 and 1990-91. The first year allocation is approximately \$350,000,000 with 1912.5 positions (legislative count), distributed as follows. The 2nd year has the same number of positions and about 10% more money.
