This bill prohibits smoking in enclosed areas on ferries. The Committee Amendment (H-200) restricts the application of the bill to enclosed areas "in which the public is allowed." It also provides a \$100 fine for the person smoking and a ferry operator who does not post "no smoking" signs in appropriate locations.

The original bill would have permitted the York Hospital to be essentially exempt from regulation by the Maine Health Care Finance Commission. The Committee Amendment (H-598) permits the Commission to make a special adjustment to the extent that a border hospital acted reasonably and necessarily in incurring extraordinary costs in response to unique circumstances affecting border hospitals.
