LD 250, as originally proposed, limited the annual registration fee on municipally-owned dams to \$5. Committee amendment A (H-15) extended the \$5 registration fee to all dams and added an appropriation and fiscal note to reflect the decrease in revenues coming to the dam registration program. The amended version was indefinitely postponed after the Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs rejected the fiscal impact.
