SUMMARY

This bill changes the law regarding the law enforcement authority of personnel of the State Fire Marshal's Office in two ways.

First, the bill, reflecting a change in the organizational structure of the Fire Marshal's office, clarifies that fire investigators but not fire inspectors are vested with powers of arrest.

Secondly, the bill proposes an expansion of the powers of arrest of fire investigators. The bill grants fire investigators the same law enforcement authority as sheriffs within their respective counties.

This bill allows sales of liquor on Memorial Day and Sundays to commence at 6 a.m. and continue until 1 a.m.

Committee Amendment "A" strikes that part of the bill which allows sales to begin before noon on Memorial Day and allows Sunday sales of liquor, in communities which have not prohibited Sundays sales, to begin at 11 a.m.

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
