SUMMARY

The original bill allowed racing dates to be set for a 3-year period.

The committee amendment deleted the original bill, but retained the intention found in section 3 of the bill to provide the Harness Racing Commission with the authority to suspend licenses. The amendment also reduced from 4 to 3 the number of votes required for the 5 member commission to approve concurrent racing dates for licensees, deleted language which applied to actions permitted only during 1986, and added an emergency preamble and emergency clause.

The bill proposed that the violations of the branding law by a dealer be counted separately for each shipper. At present, all violations are counted together.

SUMMARY

The bill prohibited participation in competition, exhibitions and events for a 5-year period by those convicted of the crime of cruelty to animals and by those guilty of the civil violation of cruelty to animals.

The committee amendment, S-35, added an emergency preamble and clause.

The House amendment made it clear that "firms, corporations or unincorporated associations and societies" were included under the bill.
