An Act Relating to Confidentiality of Investigative Records of Boards and Commissions

SUMMARY

The Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Division of Licensing and Enforcement is authorized to investigate complaints against persons licensed by the boards and commissions within the department. This bill makes investigative files of the department confidential. The bill establishes limited exceptions to the confidentiality rule for investigative files, among which are disclosure to the licensee when it has been decided to hold an adjudicatory hearing or when suspension or revocation is sought in administrative court, and disclosure at the commissioner's discretion to avoid imminent and serious harm. The provision of current law authorizing disclosure of the disposition of a complaint would not be changed by this bill.

Committee Amendment "A" makes clear that complaint records of the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation are to be confidential only until the investigation is conducted. It also makes clear that records of the Attorney General will continue to be confidential even if provided to the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation.

House Amendment "A" to Committee Amendment "A" adds additional exceptions for facts in the public domain and for disclosure to the person being investigated, unless the commissioner determines that such disclosure would prejudice the investigation.

SUMMARY

This bill raises the per diem of the Board of Dental Examiners from \$35 to \$125 a day and the compensation of the secretary-treasurer of the board from \$2,500 to \$3,600 per year.

Committee Amendment "A" sets the per diem at the legislative per diem and allows the board to determine the salary of the secretary-treasurer.

Senate Amendment "A" adds an allocation section to the bill.
