### SUMMARY

This bill makes technical corrections to the laws regarding suspension of one's driver's license for operating a motor vehicle under the influence of intoxicants. In addition, the bill increases the period of license suspension for a first time OUI conviction from 90 to 180 days.

### SUMMARY

This bill allows wine retailers, with the permission of the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages, to purchase wine directly from a winery or wine broker rather than a licensed wholesale wine distributor if no wholesale wine distributor in the State carries the product sought.

#### SUMMARY

This bill allows a notary public to solemnize the marriage of certain relatives notwithstanding the general prohibition on performance of notarial act for relatives.

Committee Amendment "A" requires that, if a notary performs the marriage of a relative, the marriage certificate must be signed and the marriage witnessed by a third unrelated party. The amendment also makes the bill an emergency measure.
