All Adopted Amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action is listed to the right of the title. If final House and Senate action differ, both are listed. Committee Reports and Floor Action are abbreviated as follows:

LD 259 An Act to Prohibit Motor Vehicles on Beaches LV/WD

SUMMARY

At present, motor vehicles and motor driven cycles may enter a public beach upon paying \$20 for a municipal permit. This bill prohibits motor vehicles and motor driven cycles from entering a public beach. Violation would be a Class E crime.

SUMMARY

Present law contains a tire weight limit of 600 pounds per inch width. Federal regulations (49 CFR 571.119) require tires to be marked with the maximum load rating and the corresponding pressure.

The bill replaces this with a requirement that the weight shall not exceed the rated load marked on the tire.

SUMMARY

This bill increases ferry service to Matinicus Isle from once a month to twice a month, and appropriates \$4,000 per year from the General Fund.

CA (S-24) This amendment replaces the requirement in the bill that ferry service be provided to Matinicus on a twice a month basis by a requirement for service 24 times a year, in order to allow for seasonal variations in need. It also adds an emergency clause.

HB (H-715) clarifies that ferry service must be provided at least 12 times a year.
