JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE BILL SUMMARIES AUGUST 1989

All Adopted Amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action is listed to the right of the title. If final House and Senate action differ, both are listed. Committee Reports and Floor Action are abbreviated as follows:

LD 338 An Act to Clarify Costs Associated with the Purchase of Land by School Administrative Units

SUMMARY

Currently, there is no provision in the statutes addressing reimbursement to a unit for purchasing land which is not part of a school construction project. The bill includes the cost of purchase of land other than that in conjunction with a school construction project as a minor capital cost.

AMENDMENTS ADOPTED

S-43

The committee amendment (S-43) requires that these land purchases be approved by the legislative body of the school administrative unit and by the commissioner.

The bill was carried over in the Appropriations Committee.

LD 355	An Act to Allow School Districts to Waive Up to 5 Days of Kindergarten for Screening

SUMMARY

This bill authorizes local school units to use up to 5 kindergarten instructional days during the school year for screening next year's incoming kindergarten class for special needs. The committee amendment provided that use of those screening days must be consistent with a plan for their use approved by the Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services. The committee amendment also adds an emergency preamble, emergency clause and fiscal note.

SUMMARY

This bill would have authorized elementary and secondary school students to refuse to participate in any educational course requirement involving the harmful or destructive use of animals and establishes a process in the school to develop an alternative education project, if possible. The bill also requires the school to notify students of their right and prohibits discrimination against students based on their exercise of this right.

The amendment would have clarified and expanded on several parts of the original bill by: (1) adding a definition of "harmful or destructive use" and applying that term consistently in the bill, (2) redefining "alternative education project" to include a broad range of equivalent alternatives, many of
