All Adopted Amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H-584 or S-222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action is listed to the right of the title. If final House and Senate action differ, both are listed. Committee Reports and Floor Action are abbreviated as follows:

#### SUMMARY

This bill broadens the eligibility requirements for the 15% state payment of retired teacher group health insurance to include dependents of eligible participants if those dependents have at least 10 years of creditable service as teachers and receive retirement benefits from the Maine State Retirement System.

#### SUMMARY

This bill requires that the Maine State Retirement System treat medical information of any kind that is in its possession as confidential information

Committee Amendment "A" assures that an employee can have access to any medical information pertaining to the employee. It also authorizes access by the employer for claims relating to workers' compensation or other benefits, while preserving the confidentiality of the information, except when involved in proceedings regarding these claims.

In 1983, the United States Congress gave states the right to allocate a portion of a person's military retirement to that person's spouse upon a divorce. There was, however, no provision for persons divorced before 1983. This bill allows persons divorced from members of the Armed Forces before 1983 to bring a court action for partition of the member's retirement benefits.

Aging, Retirement and Veterans

Committee Amendment "A" makes a technical correction and adds a fiscal note which states that any court costs involved can be absorbed by the Judicial Department.

House Amendment "A" to Committee Amendment "A" replaces the word "partition" by the words 'set aside or divide'.

#### SUMMARY

Currently, members of the Maine State Retirement System may qualify for retirement benefits upon reaching 60 years of age or upon completion of 25 years of service. However, those who retire after 25 years of service before reaching 60 years of age have their retirement benefit reduced by the percentage that a life annuity due at 60 years of age bears to the life annuity due at the age at which the person actually retires. This bill allows teachers to qualify for full retirement benefits at 55 years of age if they have completed 30 years of service.
