SUMMARY

Existing law prohibits the sale of diseased horses but does not prohibit the renting of diseased horses for riding and other uses at summer camps and other recreational uses. The bill prohibited the sale, rental or consignment of diseased horses.

SUMMARY

The bill amended provisions of laws concerning ferrets, the use of live animals in raffles and would have reenacted penalties for trespass by animals.

The committee amendment deleted the original bill much of which duplicated existing statute. The amendment retains the intention of the original bill to permit walking of domesticated ferrets on a leash. Under current law, domesticated ferrets are only allowed off the owner's premises if they are caged. The amendment also states that animal welfare laws do not apply to lobsters or shellfish and allows the use of live animals in fund-raising events such as "cow chip casino" or frog races.
