#### SUMMARY

This bill limits the circumstances under which candidates who have withdrawn or become disqualified after being nominated in a primary or by a political committee may be replaced. The bill provides that candidates, other than those for United States Senator or Representative, who withdraw or become disqualified on or after the 1st of September preceding the general election or on or after the 30th day preceding any other election, may not be replaced with another candidate.

This bill allows full-time deputy sheriffs, whether or not they are paid a salary, to keep the fees paid them for service of civil process and other duties, if those services are performed while off-duty.

## SUMMARY

This bill limits the instances in which a party may replace a candidate who has withdrawn from the general election. Barring cases where death or debilitating injury are the cause for withdrawal, a party may not name a replacement nominee if a nominee withdrew after the first of August preceding the general election. If a replacement nominee may be made, that replacement candidate must be named no later than the 3rd Monday in August preceding the general election.
