LD 489 An Act Concerning Bear Hunting with Dogs

SUMMARY

This bill sought to prohibit the hunting of bear with more than 6 dogs at any one time, and provides for civil penalties for violation of this provision. The committee amendment deleted the civil penalties in the bill.

SUMMARY

WALKER

Current law provides for an open season on deer in each calendar year from the 5th Monday preceding Thanksgiving to November 30th. The Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife has authority to shorten the season within the statutory framework, and for the past several years has shortened the season to 4 weeks with the season coming to an end on the Saturday following Thanksgiving.

MIN

This bill sought to extend by 5 days the statutory framework within which the commissioner may establish the annual deer hunting season. With this change in place, the 1990 deer hunting season could have been established through the rule-making process to begin on November 3rd and extend through December 1st, attempting to eliminate many of the conflicts which develop between various resource user groups when the deer hunting season opens in late October as it did last fall.

LD 521 An Act to Allow Handicapped Fishers to Use Electric Motors on Restricted Fishing Waters
